HB 2964, as introduced, allows fees to be assessed, but removes the requirements that fees be assessed to people accessing their medical records.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB2964 removes the mandatory fee for copies of medical records requested by attorneys, insurance companies, or through subpoenas. Providers may now charge this fee at their discretion. This change does not have a direct fiscal impact on the state budget.
