**Research Analysis**

HB 2975 as introduced adds an additional option for nutrient management plan amendments that remove poultry waste offsite. Adds a misdemeanor offense punishable by a fine of no more than \$5,000 for any person to sell, transfer, do business in sales of poultry waste, or to advertise for sale more than 10 tons of poultry waste per calendar year without a valid poultry waste applicator's certificate or ODAFF registered poultry feeding operation.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 2975 modifies the requirements of certified poultry waste applicators as well as establishes a potential fine for individuals meeting certain criteria regarding poultry waste who have not obtained a valid poultry waste applicator's certificate from the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry (ODAFF). Per ODAFF, these modifications would have no fiscal impact on the agency; therefore, this measure has no direct fiscal or revenue considerations for the state.
