**Research Analysis**

HB 3132, as introduced, requires the Board of Regents at each public college and university to review its accrediting agencies to determine if they have used a diversity, equity, and inclusion practice in connection with accreditation over the past five years. If so, the regents must find a new accreditor that has not used DEI practices. If no such accreditor exists, they must report their findings to legislative leaders, and annually search for a new accreditor.

Any agreement between a college or university and its accreditor that attempts to circumvent or violate this law is void. The measure authorizes the Attorney General to investigate violations.
