HB 3267 adds breaking and entering into an occupied dwelling without the intention to commit any crime as a Class C2 offense.

Fiscal Analysis

This measure establishes new offense definitions related to C2 felony breaking and entering. Persons convicted of such an offense shall be punishable by imprisonment in the Department of Corrections for a term of not more than 7 years and shall serve 20% of the sentence imposed before release from custody. Any resulting change to the revenues collected by the Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) or change in the costs incurred by the Department of Corrections (DOC) are expected to be immaterial and/or absorbed by the agencies. Therefore, this measure in its current form is anticipated to be budget neutral.
