**Research Analysis**

HB 3305 prohibits any renewed registration of a vehicle from being backdated to the date of expiration. A renewed registration must be valid for the registration period selected by the owner, whether annual or biennial, beginning on the date of renewal.

**Fiscal Analysis**

House Bill 3305 amends 47 O.S. § 1115 and § 1132 to prohibit backdating vehicle registrations for late renewals and certain late initial registrations. In addition, the measure requires the registration period to run from the date of renewal/registration for the term selected by the owner. Administratively, implementation may require some system updates within Service Oklahoma, but such updates are expected to be absorbable within existing budgetary resources. Therefore, the measure is not anticipated to have a direct fiscal impact on the state budget or appropriations.
