Research Analysis

The proposed policy committee substitute for HB 3312 requires school districts to annually provide students with age-appropriate instruction on firearm safety. The Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training (CLEET), in consultation with Department of Education, will determine in which grade to begin providing instruction. The agencies will also approve a curriculum, which may not bear a brand affiliation and must be politically neutral. Instruction for students in grades K-5 must focus on not touching a firearm. Instruction for students in grades 6-12 will focus on safe storage, handling, avoiding injury, and what to do if a firearm is found.

Each school will determine how to incorporate the instruction, although instruction by a CLEET-certified SRO, or member of law enforcement will be considered best practice. Instruction may never involve live ammunition. Lastly, parents must be given the opportunity to opt-their children out.
