**Research Analysis**

HB 3404 as introduced changes the name of the Oklahoma Controlled Burn Indemnity Fund to the Oklahoma Prescribed Burn Indemnity Fund. Updates statutory references. Prohibits reimbursement to participating landowners for certain damages. Removes requirements to participate in fund. Provides additional requirements to participate in fund.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 3404 modifies and updates the Oklahoma Prescribed Burn Indemnity Fund at the Oklahoma Conservation Commission. The measure outlines specific criteria that must be included in a submitted burn plan as well as raises the fee paid to the Oklahoma Conservation Commission from One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) to Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) to submit a completed burn plan. The measure also caps the total amount paid for losses from any one prescribed fire event at One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00). Upon review, this measure is not anticipated to have a direct fiscal impact on current budgetary resources.
