**Research Analysis**

**HB3414**, as introduced, updates state accounting practices by requiring the Office of Management and Enterprise Services (OMES) to add a reporting function within the state’s accounting system to identify whether a contract is service-based or for staff augmentation. Additionally, OMES must revise the state accounting manual to require invoices for intangible assets to include a file path to a permanent location where the asset will be maintained for post-review.

**Fiscal Analysis**

House Bill 3414 requires OMES to create a PeopleSoft reporting function to assess whether contracts are service-driven or for staff augmentation and requires agencies to include a permanent file location on any invoice. OMES considers implementation to be a relatively small project such that additional fulltime employees would not be required. Therefore, the measure is not anticipated to have a direct fiscal impact on the state budget or appropriations.
