Research Analysis

HB 4287 establishes a system to adjust census population data by reallocating incarcerated individuals to their last-known residential addresses in Oklahoma for redistricting purposes. The act defines key terms including the Department of Corrections, State Data Center, federal correctional facilities in Oklahoma, last-known address, local government districts, and state prisons. In Federal Decennial Census years, the Department must transmit anonymized demographic and location data to the Oklahoma State Data Center. All transmitted information is confidential and released only as aggregated census-block datasets. The State Data Center will prepare population data reallocating incarcerated persons to their last-known Oklahoma addresses. This adjusted data must be used by the Oklahoma Legislative Apportionment Commission and all local political subdivisions for redistricting to ensure districts reflect true resident populations.
