**Research Analysis**

HJR 1019 as introduced, sends a constitutional amendment to a vote of the people that, if approved, would require that each political party recognized by the state of Oklahoma has the opportunity to nominate a candidate for the General Election for federal, state, county, and municipal officers. The candidate must have filed within the allotted timeframe and become the party's nominee by winning the party's primary or runoff race.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HJR 1019 proposes a legislative referendum that would require each legally recognized political party of the state to have an opportunity to nominate a candidate for the General Election including federal, state, county, and municipal officers. The measure primarily relates to a fundamental issue of democracy and any cost to the Oklahoma State Election Board is anticipated to be minimal and absorbed by existing agency resources.
