## **Research Analysis**

The engrossed version of SB 176 requires any health benefit plan that offers coverage for contraceptive drugs to provide coverage for a three-month supply at once the first time the enrollee obtains the drug and a six-month supply each subsequent time regardless if the enrollee was in the health benefit plan the first time they obtained the drug. An enrollee may obtain only one six-month supply during each six-month period. Nothing in this section will prohibit an enrollee from requesting a smaller supply of a contraceptive drug and nothing will be construed to require the coverage for any medications that could be used to terminate a pregnancy.
