**Bill Analysis**

SB 1267 modifies discovery as it relates to the requiring the state to disclose evidence to the defense by expanding such discovery to include offense reports, supplemental reports, body-worn camera footage, dashcam footage, and 9-1-1 audio recordings made in connection with the particular case in the form or forms in which such evidence is ordinarily maintained or in a reasonably usable form. The expansion also includes preliminary reports, screening results, and analyses performed or stored electronically for statements made by experts. The measure expands “informant” to include a person who provides, or who the prosecutor intends to provide, testimony about admissions or other relevant information pursuant to a deal, promise, inducement, or benefit between the person and the state. The measure requires the defense to provide the prosecution with a curriculum vitae and written description of the substance of the proposed testimony for any expert it intends to call as a witness at the hearing.
