**Bill Summary and  
Fiscal Analysis:**

HB 1462 directs the courts in all criminal prosecutions and juvenile proceedings to prioritize orders of payments of restitution to victims until the office of the district attorney certifies that the restitution is paid in full. The Administrative Office of the Courts(AOC) has estimated the provisions will have an annual total impact on collections of \$3,299,866. The AOC notes this will affect collections to the Courts' various revolving funds and other state agencies' revolving funds. This fiscal impact is broken down as follows:

Supreme Court: \$164,464  
District Courts: \$2,891,354  
Other state agencies/local entities: \$244,048
