**Bill Summary and
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB1229 modifies provisions relating to the Executive Director of Service Oklahoma, establishes new requirements governing the collection, storage, use, and deletion of personally identifiable information associated with REAL ID Noncompliant Driver Licenses and Identification Cards, creates a biometric data waiver process, authorizes issuance of certain licenses or identification cards without a photo, requires recurring compliance attestations, mandates joint compliance reviews by the Chief Information Officer and the State Auditor and Inspector, and provides for removal of the Executive Director in specified circumstances.

The bill requires new operational, compliance, and information technology requirements including the creation and maintenance of separate and siloed databases for personally identifiable information associated with REAL ID Noncompliant credentials, implementation of biometric data waiver processes, mandated data deletion protocols, new credential issuance workflows, recurring compliance attestations, and coordination with external compliance reviews. The one-time implementation cost of these requirements is estimated to be approximately \$5.25 million, derived from information technology development, database segregation, security controls, audit readiness, and compliance reporting infrastructure. These costs are in addition to not yet determined ongoing administrative and operational impacts required to maintain compliance in subsequent fiscal years. SAI estimates a maximum recurring cost of \$50,000 to comply with the bill requirements.
