**Bill Summary and
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 1584 changes the time frame that sexual assault evidence kits, or other DNA evidence if a kit is not collected, must be sent to the appropriate accredited crime laboratory for forensic testing from 20 days to 10 days after obtaining the evidence by a law enforcement agency, unless the victim requests that the sexual assault evidence kit not be tested. This measure also states that the kits collected must be processed by the crime laboratory to which they were submitted within 30 days of receiving them.

The measure yields a fiscal impact of approximately \$6,568,500, consisting of a one-time impact of \$6,036,500 with the cost breakdown below, and an annual recurring cost of \$532,000 for four additional criminalists.
