**Bill Summary and  
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 1799 prohibits any person from applying sludge generated from wastewater, compost that uses such sludge, and any other material that contains such sludge on any land in the state, and no such sludge shall be sold in the state for such use. The proposal directs DEQ to conduct a study and to develop a long-term plan to prohibit the land application of septage.

The DEQ shares that if enacted, there would be a reduction of \$20,000 in permitting fees from septage pumpers who have land application permits.
