**Bill Summary and  
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 1879 states that a voter must meet certain qualifications to apply for an absentee ballot, not including in-person absentee ballots.

The one-time fiscal impact of the measure is estimated to be \$150,000. The measure would require the State Election Board to redesign, print, and distribute new absentee ballot materials, including applications, affidavits, instructions, and warnings. The measure would also require programming and updates to the OK Voter Portal and the election management software. Lastly, new County Election Board training and materials would be necessary to ensure the changes are implemented. There may be postage savings by the County Election Board offices due to a projected possible reduction in absentee ballot requests.
