**Bill Summary and
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 1899 modifies the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program (OHLAP), also known as Oklahoma's Promise. It expands eligibility to children of certified personnel of school districts who apply for participation beginning in the 2026-2027 school year. Eligibility is limited to children of those individuals who have served in a certified position for a minimum of 10 years.

The Regents anticipate additional staffing costs of \$800,000 for application review, correspondence, and program management. In addition, the Regents estimate a need for an additional \$240,018,102 in the first year of the expanded eligibility, \$338,589,381 in the second year, \$424,755,394 for the third year, \$488,587,293 for year four, and \$507,194,885 in year five. This leads to a total impact of \$240,818,102 in the first year, but a \$2,003,145,055 impact over five years.
