**Bill Summary and  
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 1911 states that offenders aged 15-17 who are convicted of second-degree rape or attempted rape, as well as rape by instrumentation or attempt thereof, are to be charged as an adult.

A review of current population data identified zero inmates age 17 or under at JHCC incarcerated for Rape II and zero individuals in the delayed sentencing program at BJCC for Rape II. This data was reviewed to assess whether a current baseline population could be used to estimate potential impact. However, the absence of a current population does not provide sufficient information to determine how frequently the proposed enhancements would apply in the future. The Department of Corrections does not have access to data identifying how often these enhancements would occur; therefore, a reliable fiscal impact cannot be determined at this time.
