16	A. Electric vehicle charging providers that provide electric
17	vehicle charging stations that are open to the general public shall
18	not require a user to hold or obtain a membership, subscription, or
19	similar account to access or use the charging services. In
20	addition, providers shall not collect, store, or require any
21	personally identifiable information from users except for
22	information strictly necessary to complete the payment transaction.
23	Providers shall provide an option for users to pay through
24	universally accepted payment methods, including, but not limited to,

credit cards, debit cards, or mobile payment systems, without
requiring any additional registration or disclosure of personal
data.

в. This section shall not apply to private charging stations or those designated for exclusive use by specific individuals, businesses, or organizations. SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025. 60-1-11636 JBH 12/16/24
