10	WHEREAS, the Oklahoma House of Representatives reminds us that
11	Child Abuse can be prevented and everyone has a role to play; and
12	WHEREAS, every child deserves to be safe, nurtured, and
13	supported in caring relationships, and every family deserves to be
14	safe, nurtured, and supported in their community; and
15	WHEREAS, the estimated cost to treat the effects of child
16	maltreatment in the United States exceeds One Billion Dollars
17	annually; and
18	WHEREAS, everyone has a role to play in preventing child abuse,
19	and all citizens must become aware of the importance of supporting
20	parents to raise their children in a safe, nurturing environment;
21	and
22	WHEREAS, too many of our community's children are exposed to
23	extreme and sustained stress-like child abuse and neglect, which can
24	be devastating to a child's development; and

WHEREAS, we lay the foundation for children's later growth and development when the entire community takes responsibility for creating healthy environments in which to raise its children; and WHEREAS, the children in our community who have fallen victim to maltreatment deserve high-quality, evidence-based services delivered by committed and well-supported professionals; and

7 WHEREAS, effective child abuse prevention programs succeed 8 because of community partnerships created among families, social 9 service agencies, schools, businesses, law enforcement agencies, 10 faith-based organizations, and other child-serving agencies; and 11 WHEREAS, it is easier to build healthy and strong children than

12 repair broken adults.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 60TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

15 THAT the Oklahoma House of Representatives declares April as 16 Child Abuse Prevention Month in Oklahoma and urges all citizens, 17 businesses, and social institutions to dedicate themselves to the 18 task of supporting parents in their critical job of raising safe, 19 healthy children and ensuring the health and safety of all children 20 in Oklahoma.
