12	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
13	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-708a of Title 63, unless there
14	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
15	A. As used in this section:
16	1. "Surgical smoke" means the gaseous by-product, including
17	surgical plume, smoke plume, bio-aerosols, laser-generated airborne
18	contaminants, and lung-damaging dust, produced by an energy-
19	generating device used in a room in which a surgical procedure is
20	performed; and
21	2. "Surgical smoke evacuation system" means equipment designed
22	to capture and neutralize surgical smoke at the site of origin and
23	before the surgical smoke makes contact with the eyes or respiratory
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tract of any individual occupying a room in which a surgical procedure is performed. B. A hospital or ambulatory surgical center licensed by the State Department of Health shall adopt and implement a policy to prevent an individual's exposure to surgical smoke through the use of a surgical smoke evacuation system during each planned surgical procedure that is likely to generate surgical smoke.
