7	A Resolution affirming Oklahoma's right to opt out of
8	the federal REAL ID system; supporting the state's obligation to offer residents a meaningful choice between REAL ID-compliant and -noncompliant identification; and opposing unwarranted collection and sharing of personal data.
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12	WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that the enactment into law by
13	the United States Congress of the federal REAL ID Act of 2005,
14	Public Law Number 109-13, is an action that individual Oklahomans do
15	have the right to refuse to comply with the enactment under the
16	principles of federalism protected by the Tenth Amendment to the
17	United States Constitution; and
18	WHEREAS, a REAL ID-compliant driver license or identification
19	card requires the collection and retention of personal and sensitive
20	biometric information from each applicant; and
21	WHEREAS, the State of Oklahoma does provide an option for
22	Oklahomans to choose between a REAL ID-compliant or a REAL ID-
23	noncompliant driver license or identification card; and
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<sup>1</sup> WHEREAS, this choice provides a distinction without a difference <sup>2</sup> as the state, in fact, collects, stores, and shares all applicants' <sup>3</sup> personal and sensitive biometric information in exactly the same <sup>4</sup> manner for both the REAL ID-compliant and the REAL ID-noncompliant <sup>5</sup> option.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 1ST SESSION
OF THE 60TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

8 THAT the Oklahoma State Senate recognizes that Oklahomans opting 9 out of REAL ID understand the limitations for federal purposes of 10 the REAL ID-noncompliant driver license or identification card, and 11 they expect in return that their personal information will not be 12 shared with the federal government absent a court-approved warrant. 13 THAT the Oklahoma State Senate affirms the right of Oklahomans 14 to refuse participation in the federal REAL ID program and urges the 15 State of Oklahoma to continue offering both compliant and 16 noncompliant identification options, and further believes that the 17 State of Oklahoma should protect the personal information of our 18 citizens who choose a REAL ID-noncompliant driver license or 19 identification card by prohibiting the sharing of their personal 20 identifiable information including biometric samples, biometric 21 data, or biometric templates, absent a court-approved warrant.

THAT the Oklahoma State Senate recognizes the importance of protecting Oklahomans' right to refuse participation in the voluntary federal REAL ID system, supporting a genuine choice

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1	between compliant and noncompliant IDs, and protecting Oklahomans
2	from both coerced compliance and the illusion of security through a
3	distinction without a difference.
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
